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## 1. Introduction to Sannihita

**Sannihita is a Non-Profit organization and a women headed autonomous organization. Sannihita Center for Women & Girl Children Society was established in the year 2000. We have worked with urban poor women, on issues of gender discrimination, poverty-violence, displacement, shelter, street food and housing rights.**

### **Vision:**

Creating and developing a peaceful platform which ensures peace to the world, nation and to an individual irrespective of their caste, creed, religion and gender. Every individual must be able to exercise complete freedom and must enjoy pride & privilege of food, health and shelter. Make a society of children with the world of joy, by ensuring a violence free society transforming into a good nation and eventually to a good world.

### **Mission:**

- To create and enrich platforms by identifying the required various resources.
- To extend a legal aid to the identified groups of deprived women and children in unorganized sectors.
- To create a harmonious life space for women, children and vulnerable communities.

### **Aims & Objectives:**

- To support poor women and girls
- To increase awareness and means of combating violence and discrimination against women and girls in the society.
- To facilitate Technical Training for adolescent girl children in various trades and professions
- To provide information about livelihood opportunities and educational programs for poor women and children
- Focused approach to initiate programs on women's right to shelter housing
- To enable the community to gain access to health care, education, information, legal aid, campaign and activities towards gender based issues.
- To help women & children explore and develop their creativity
- Conduct/ participate in community-based research and advocacy based studies on relevant issues
- Advocacy towards public policy and peoples centered.

### **Our History:**

- Worked on issues of women's rights, gender equality, self-help groups, poverty, homelessness, street children, girl child education, housing rights and campaigning against violence on women and girl children. Conducted studies on dalith, minority and reproductive rights of women. Also conducted studies on street vendors.



- From 2000 to 2003, we have provided free basti counseling centers, bastipanchayats and free legal aid and counseling for women.
- From 2000 to 2003, we have conducted surveys on the homelessness
- From 2007 to 2009, worked with SarvaSikshaAbhiyan on Non-Residential Bridge Course (special training centers). We have run 6 N-RSTC (Non- Residential Special Training Center).
- In the year 2009 to 2012, we got permission from the state education department and SarvaSikshaAbhiyan and implemented RSTC scheme within the schools
- From 2009 to 2013, we have conducted studies on the street food and organized State & National street food festival. Sannihita is the first organization to work with women street food vendors and conducted street food festival at National level.

## **Activities:**

### **2000:**

- Provided counseling centers for the adolescent children in five basthies on livelihood.

### **2001 to 2007:**

- Counseled women on domestic violence issues. Around 2000 women were covered.
- Conducted surveys and studies on homelessness in Hyderabad district. Covered around 50,000 people in this survey.
- Conducted studies on poverty, women's reproductive health, livelihood, adult literacy, self-help groups, rehabilitation policy and housing rights issues.
- Participated and conducted National level workshops on shelter and housing rights issues (Worked with organizations like National Housing Rights Movement).
- Done advocacy for women's housing rights and shelter needs.
- Conducted and organized women's rights campaigns on Violence against women, in united Andhra Pradesh.

### **2003 to 2009:**

- Conducted, coordinated and promoted the Sixteen days of activism program, through the network of AMAN Domestic violence group. It is a state, national and international wide program.

### **2007:**

- Started working on street children's education and shelter programs.
- Conducted NRBC'S (Non – Residential Bridge Course) with the help of SSA (SarvaShikshaAbhiyan)

### **2009 to 2022:**

- We have started homes for orphans, semi-orphans, homeless children and distress children especially for girls in 2009 and for boys in 2012 in government schools to give the access to the right to shelter, food, and education, health to ensure protection and emotional care to the



children. We have raised around 600 children. Our other activities are providing security to the children, mainstreaming them to the schools, KGBV'S and Gurukuls, conducting health camps, taking children for the outings etc.

**2022:**

- We have established "Sannihita Shelter for Patient's Attendants" in Government Maternity Hospital, Koti as we proceeding towards the women health issues.
- We have been campaigning on POSCH Committees and women rights.

## 2. Sannihita Homes

We are presently running three Girls homes and one Boys home with around 350 children, who are from vulnerable communities from the age group of 7 years to 18 years. We also help our elder children as per their actions and aspirations. We are in the mission of providing these children shelter, food, education, health care and Protection.

We encourage these children to take shelter in the running government schools where there is no strength of children but have rooms that can accommodate children. We motivate our children to get disciplined to go to school. We provide various kinds of skills to make them empowered. We facilitate mentoring. We expose these children to various social issues like gender equality, environment protection, women's rights, to engage them towards building positive energies.

We work on training children with life skills. We facilitate, conduct, and encourage children and our team for perspective building.

We send children to various cultural activities, outings, awareness campaigns on child rights, children education, girl child issues, violence against women, gender equality, PNDD, ACTS, Fundamental rights, caste class discrimination, environmental protection, energy saving, hygiene, and health issues.

### **Our Vulnerability criteria:**

1. Girl children who are neglected by the parents because of the gender discrimination.
2. Children of those mothers who face domestic violence.
3. Children who face violence from fathers.
4. Children who are migrated because of their parent's livelihood.
5. Children who are in begging.
6. Children who face abuse because of adultery.
7. Children of sex workers (they openly do not say that).
8. Children of daily wage laborers.
9. Children who are vulnerable towards sexual abuse by their own family members and neighborhood.
10. Children from homeless families.
11. Children who are coming from unregistered occupied habitations.
12. Children from economically background.
13. Children from alcohol addiction families.
14. Children lose parents in accidents, hazardous workplace etc.
15. Children whose parents are doing housekeeping work.
16. Children who have only guardians.
17. Children who are never enrolled.
18. Children who are school dropouts.

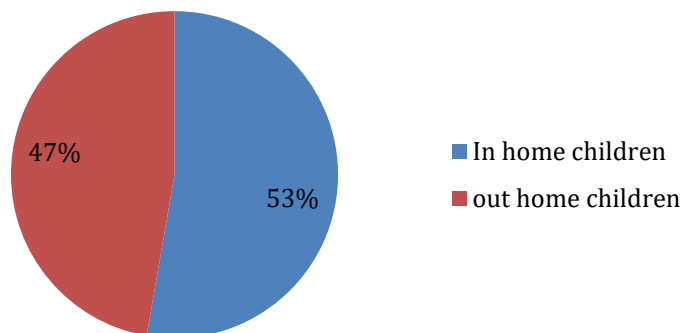

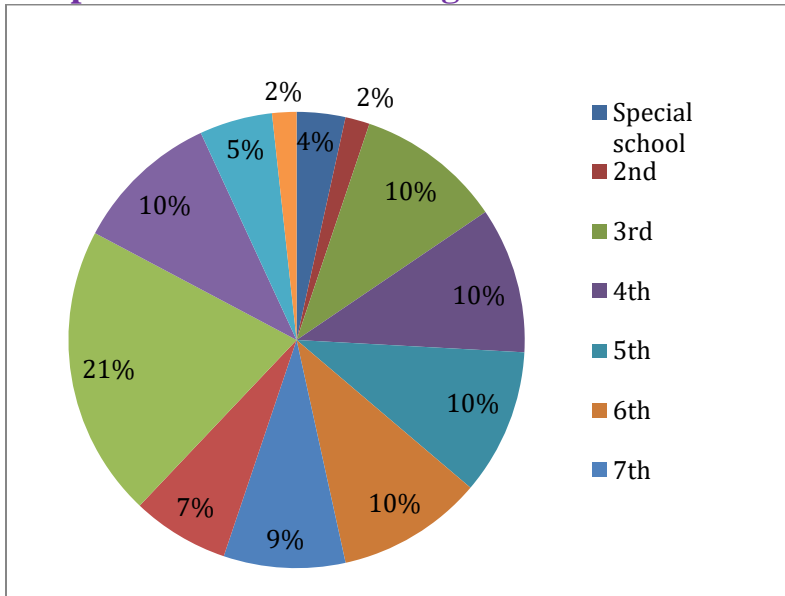

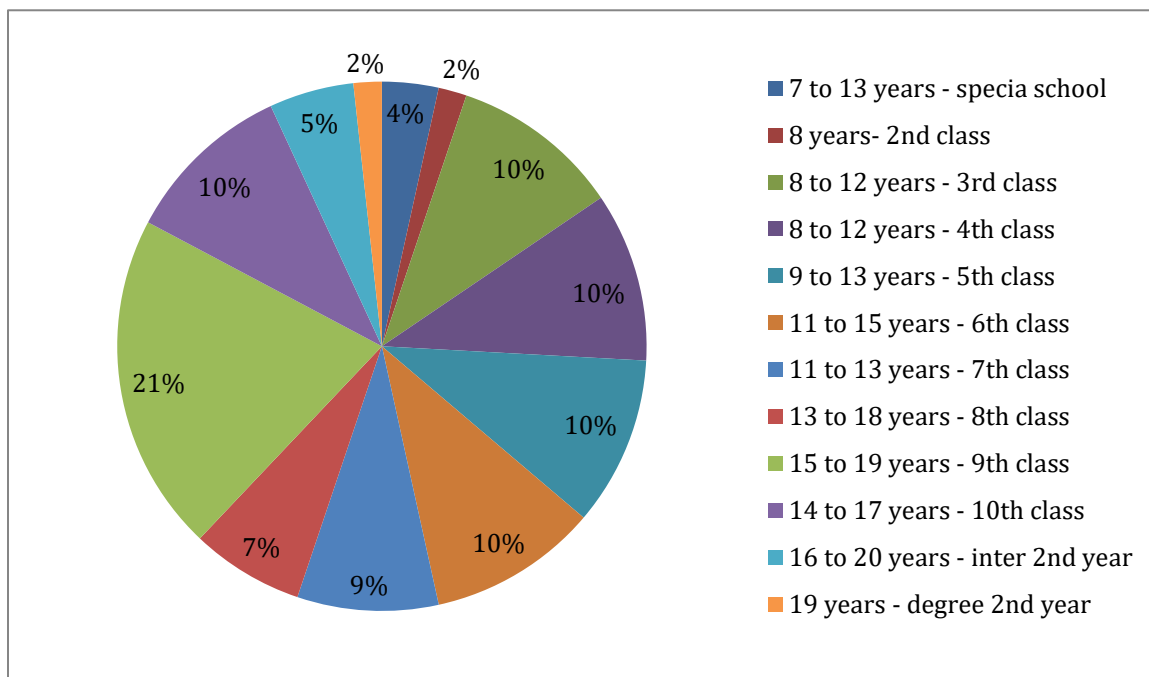

## 5.1. Key Challenges and Resolution

1	<p>In the first quarter, as the school has declared the summer holidays most of the parents have come and taken their children for holidays. Even after completing the holidays, few children have not returned to the home. Bringing those children back and safeguarding them was a challenge to the home team.</p>	<p>The team has done the follow up of those children and given counseling on the phone and also motivated the children and the parents to send back the child to the home. After many follow up initiatives, the children have come back to the home.</p>
2	<p>During the holidays, parents tend to take the children with them. This might be unsafe for the children as the parents due to their poverty would engage the children in begging, rag picking like activities to earn some money. Retaining the children back at home is the tough challenge.</p>	<p>During the holidays we have conducted a summer camp with different variety of activities and engaged the children in interesting recreational activities.</p>
3	<p>Doing the follow up of the children's staying in other hostels: When the internal team has contacted the hostel wardens to interact with our children the wardens have not given the response. Later we came to know that they have got transferred other place. In these circumstances, it became difficult for the team to know the actual needs of the children.</p>	<p>The internal team has taken the contact of the new wardens, explained them the hurdles they have been facing to reach out the children and requested them to give the information precisely about the children whenever there is a requirement/need.</p>
4	<p>The high school children are throwing the used sanitary napkins in the toilets instead of throwing in the dustbin that was placed in the washroom. This has caused the drainage blockage and overflow of the drainage water. This overflow has caused inconvenience to our children and to the surrounding people. We have counseled the children regarding not throwing the used sanitary napkins in the toilets. Even after giving counseling, the high school children are not changing their behavior and still repeating the same. This was causing drainage blockage frequently.</p>	<p>Given counseling to the high school children.</p> <p>Whenever the drainage blockage has occurred, we have contacted the GHMC and cleared the problem of the blockage.</p> <p>Sometimes when the GHMC has denied our complaint, we had to deploy a septic tank cleaner to get the work done.</p>



## 5.2. Children Success Stories

- 1) 1. The child N. Spoorthi has joined in the home in 2017 in 4<sup>th</sup> class. Her parental status is both parents and has joined the home due to lack of the shelter. The child has **passed her 10<sup>th</sup> class examinations with 7.2 points in English medium** in 2022 June.
- 2) The child L. Sai Priyanka has joined the home in 2018 in 6<sup>th</sup> class. She is an orphan. She has passed her **10<sup>th</sup> class examinations with 7 points in English medium** in 2022 June.
- 3) The child R. Throshitha has joined the home in 2017 in 4<sup>th</sup> class. Her parental status is single parent. She has passed her **10<sup>th</sup> class examination with 8 points in English medium** in 2022 June.
- 4) The child S. Mounika has joined in the home in 2016 in 2<sup>nd</sup> class. She is an orphan and took the shelter in the home for about 6 years. She is an orphan. She has passed her **10<sup>th</sup> class examination in Telugu medium with 6.7 points** in 2022 June.
- 5) The child B. Madhumitha has joined the home in 2017 in 5<sup>th</sup> class. Her parental status is single parent and took the shelter in the home for about 5 years. She has passed her **10<sup>th</sup> class examination in English medium with 9.2 points** in 2022 June.
- 6) The child V. Swapna has joined the home in 2013 in 1<sup>st</sup> class. The child has both the parents and she has joined the home due to lack of the shelter. She has passed her **10<sup>th</sup> class examination in English medium with 7.7 points** in 2022 June.
- 7) The child SK. Masthaan Bee has joined the home in 2012 in 1<sup>st</sup> class. She has only mother and father have got absconded. She has passed her **10<sup>th</sup> class in Telugu medium with 5.5 points** in 2022 June.
- 8) The child P. Parvathi- 10<sup>th</sup> class used to show low academic performance. The child after attaining remedial coaching, she has developed interest in education. In the quarterly examinations that were conducted in November month, the child has got marks equivalent to the class topper in English subject.

### Awards and Recognitions:

In this competition all the school children have participated. Among all these students only Sannihita children have won the first 3 prizes. This achievement shows the ability of Sannihita children in extra-curricular activities. Talent mentoring was done for the children who are having special talents. This encouragement from the team side made the children enable in developing their skill and talent.

- 3) P. Nagalaxmi studying 10<sup>th</sup> class in Govt. High School, Kalasiguda on 7/1/2023 has participated in District Level Student Talent Test in Social subject. She has got **2<sup>nd</sup> prize in that test and was awarded with a shield and certificate.**

## 5.3. Education and Mentoring

### 5.3.1. Bridge Course:

The child Sompuri was never enrolled in the school before coming to the home. She even doesn't know the basics. So the internal team has conducted special classes and taught the basics like English, Telugu





alphabets and numbers. The bridging was done for a period of one month. During that period, with the fun learning activities initiated by the team, the child was able to recognize and read the alphabets and numbers. After the bridge course, we have joined the child in the Special School located in Govt. High School, Nallagutta, Secunderabad.

### **5.3.2. Remedial Coaching:**

Special remedial classes were held by the volunteers specialized in subjects. As well as, our home remedial coaching teacher has also taken classes 'for the primary and high school children. Children were grouped according to their classes and after school the children who are weak in specific subjects' special classes were taken for them.

1. The child M. Parvathi- 10<sup>th</sup> class used to show low academic performance. The child after attaining remedial coaching, she has developed interest in education. In the quarterly examinations that were conducted in November month, the child has got marks equivalent to the class topper in English subject. The child has to improve in the remaining subjects.
2. The child M. Swetha- 5<sup>th</sup> class is very poor in mathematics. She is even not able to write 2<sup>nd</sup> table as her basics are very poor. By giving remedial coaching, the child has learnt 1 to 6 tables and now she is able to write tables up to 6.

### **5.3.4. Life Skills:**

The child Sompuri has joined the home on 11/7/2022 by the CWC personnel. They found the child while begging in Sithaphalmandi area.

Characteristics of the child in the last few months:

- The child not used to maintain her clothes and always used to throw the clothes here and there in the home premises.
- Whenever the visitors come to the home, she used to look untidy with her improper attire.
- Not used to go to the school on time and also did not show any interest in education.

Improved characteristics of the child:

- The child has created the interest in education and she is going to the school on time.
- Child is maintaining her clothes neatly and has adapted proper dressing style. Now when any programs are conducted in the home the child is getting dressed very beautifully.

The internal team has made the child to attend the study hours daily and made her to read and write by this she has developed interest in education. When Balasabha was conducted, the child was encouraged to express her feelings and problems openly. Internal team has given counseling and monitored the child in maintaining her clothes and dressing neatly.

One of a female visitor of Sannihita lives in America. She has taken the online classes to the high school children for a period of 2 months on every Saturday and Sunday. Each session has lasted for about 2 hours. She has taught the way of living of American people, about the temples located in America and also taught Social subject and General Knowledge to the children.

## 5.4. Committees and Clubs

### 5.4.1. Committees

Committees involve members in the development and delivery of services, represent member opinion in decision-making, and help serve member needs through interaction. They also offer the opportunity for group problem-solving and can be a forum for presenting multiple points of view.

**There are 9 Committees in our home. We have shuffled the committees 9 times in the reporting year. The last shuffling was done on 5/1/2023.**

### 5.4.2.Clubs

**We have 6 clubs in our home.** They are:

1. **Cultural club-**The child who knows dancing, singing, dramas etc. were appointed as the committee members. The members teach the fellow children cultural activities whenever there is a program in the home.
2. **Literacy club-** In this club, the elder children help the younger children in their studies and help them in completing their homework. The members conduct essay writing, quiz competitions etc.





3. **Sports club**-The club members get to know the interest of the children and encourages them to play the games and also monitors the primary children while playing games.
4. **Gardening club**-Kids can learn so much from a tiny seed! The members sow the seeds / plant a sapling and take care of the plant by providing enough water and other required items. They engage the children in doing winter, spring, summer, and fall gardening activities.
5. **Laughing club**-Laughter Club members meet for 1 hour every weekend or fortnight. They do **laughter exercises for 30 minutes followed by Laughter Meditation**. At the end of the Laughter Session, they incorporate singing, dancing and music. Other groups will do Yoga Nidra, humming and other relaxation techniques.
6. **Craft Club**:-in this club, children make greeting cards, paintings, earrings, bangles, etc.

### 5.4.3. Bala Sabha

In our home, we have conducted Bala sabha on the regular basis. Children's issues/problems were brought to the notice of the team and in turn team has given solutions to the problem / issues. In the reporting year total **327 Balasabha meetings were conducted** in the home.

### 5.4.4 Parent Meetings

**Parents Meeting was conducted 4 times in the reporting year.**

#### Meeting No. 1:

This meeting was held on 27/5/2022. Total 51 parents have attended this meeting.

#### Meeting No. 2:

This meeting was held on 28/10/2022. Meeting agenda was

1. To know the future goals of the children.
2. To know the problems of the children and the parents.
3. To know the parents' and children's perspective towards Sannihita.

The director V. Usha Rani Madam has hosted the meeting and asked all the children to share about their future goals. For this the children and parents were divided into groups of 10 members and facilitated the children to share about their thoughts. All the children have shared their career goals.

#### Meeting No. 3:

This meeting was held on 27/1/2023. Total 35 parents have attended this meeting. In this meeting, the director V. Usha Rani madam has interacted with the parents individually and knew about their case studies.

#### Meeting No. 4:



This meeting was held on 7/3/2023. Total 33 parents have attended this meeting. This meeting was conducted on the occasion of ‘‘International Women’s Day’’. The director V. Usha Rani madam has created awareness among the children’s mothers about the status of the women in this modern society.

## 5.5. Food & Nutrition





### 5.5.1. Nutritious Care:

Providing Nutrition food care to the children is the main aspect in the home. Menu is prepared according to the children’s tastes, ideas and suggestions of home mothers as per the market value and season wise. Menu is very important as the child’s physical and mental health reflects on it. Project in-charge explains about healthy food that contains right amount of nutrients to keep our children’s body fit. Our children need healthy food very delicious as opposed to popular thinking. As it is a pandemic time more care is taken towards the children in improving their immunity by providing healthy foods. We have engaged the children in adapting good eating habits so that our future generations will be healthy and fit. The Home team explains about the nutritional values present in the food and then explains the children about their amount of nutrition intake.





### 5.5.2. Preparation of Menu

There is a food committee in the home. This committee consists of 5 members. One is the main leader and other 4 are committee members. This committee will conduct a meeting with the fellow children, will know about their likes and dislikes, health conditions as well with respect to food habits and prepare a nutritious menu list according their preferences. This committee holds the responsibility of monitoring the food quality and quantity daily. If any adulteration is done the committee head will be responsible to inform the same to the home coordinator. A menu list is prepared in advance and the cooking is done according to that list. Providing nutritious food is provided to the children, for their healthy growth is the primary objective of the committee.

## 6.1. KITS Distribution, Sanitation & Cleanliness.

### 6.1.1. Kits Distribution:

- **Welcome Kit:** The 9 newly joined children were provided with the Welcome Kit. This kit contains bathing soap, washing soap, tooth brush, bed sheet, blanket, dress, sleeping mat, locker, plate, glass, spoon, slippers, books, stationery, napkin, cosmetics, towel etc.
- **Soaps & Toiletries Kit:** This kit contains bathing soap, washing soap, shampoo, tooth brush, hair oil, tooth paste, Dettol etc. to the children on the weekly basis.



- **Books & Stationery:** All the children were provided with the books & stationery as and when required.



- **Sanitary Napkins:** Sanitary napkins are provided to the required children.



- **Clothing & Bedding Kit:** This kit includes dress, inner wears, bed sheets, towel etc. This kit is distributed to the children on the quarterly basis.





- **Shoe & Sandals:** Shoe and sandals were distributed to the children on the quarterly basis.







- **School bags distribution:** We have distributed the school bags to the children on the quarterly basis.



- **New dresses distribution:** We have provided new dresses, leggings etc to the children as and when required.







**\*Note:** The team takes the signature of the children in the **Children Stock Issue Register** before distributing the kits.

### 6.1.2. Any Ration (Survival Kits) distributed outside?

The children who are staying outside the home are getting support (providing soaps and toiletries, books and stationery, cosmetic etc) from Sannihita as and when required. In the month of March, we have extended our support to the children by distributing the ration kits. The kit consists of oil packets, pulses, rice, chilli powder, turmeric powder, salt, peanuts etc.

### 6.1.3. Sanitation & Cleanliness:

### 6.2. Repair & Maintenance

- The coolers present in the home are yet to be repaired. During quarter 1 period, as it is a summer season children needed the coolers. So we have repaired the coolers and made sure that they are well maintained and used.
- As a regular safety check up, we have checked the gap pipes and installed a new one.



- Electrical boards which were damaged are repaired instantly to protect the children while using switches.





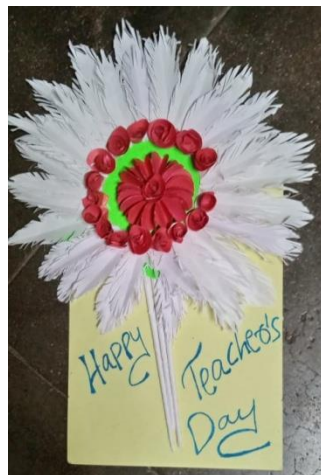
- There was drainage pipeline leakage of the children's bathroom. New drainage pipe line was installed and plumbing work was done to avoid the leakage.
- The three manholes near the home premises have got filled and overflow of the drainage water has occurred. This overflow led the drainage water to flow on the roads and in the home premises and also led the children not to use the washrooms. It also caused inconvenience to the Government Primary School, Parklane students, anganwadi children and the surrounding neighbors. So, we have deployed a cleaning person and made him to clear the blockage of the drainage water. The cleaning person has cleared the blockage and made the free drainage water flow.
- The existing geyser had direct water connection and it is causing earthling. So, we have installed new geyser in the children's bathroom.

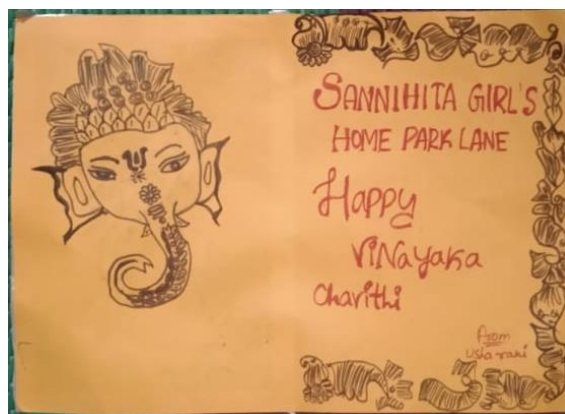

- **International Dance Day** was celebrated on 29/4/2022. Primary children have done the dance.



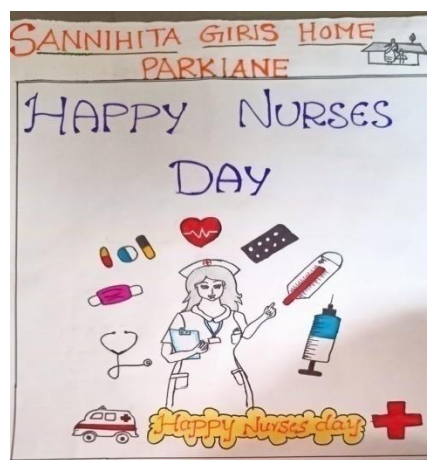
- **Mother's Day** was observed on 8/5/2022. Children have done the poster presentation.
